This year the centenary of the end of World War One is on Armistice Day 11 November. Some might think this all a bit miserable, especially as our local shops and hotels are already filled with Christmas products and decorations.

However, there is one guarantee, everyone who lives dies at some time. We do not know how, when or where. Death is so much a part of life I feel it is healthy to face the reality of it, to acknowledge the pain it brings and to remember those who have gone.

St Matthew's Church will have a thought provoking Armistice display to remember those who gave their lives. They may have gone but they are not forgotten.

As Christians we have the certainty that eternal life is offered to everyone through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. A sign of hope in a broken and sometimes dark world. It is our duty to do our best to share God's love, to provide hope and peace for the future.

A Letter From The Bishop of Grimsby

‘...they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid...’

(Micah 4:3b,4a, NRSV).

These are words which speak of a future hope, a world at peace, a real peace, and not just the absence of conflict, a sense of wellbeing, of living in harmony with the world we’ve been given to share, of wanting the best for those we’ve been given to share that world with.

Words I was reminded of recently in conversation with a Russian Second Lieutenant on one of the ships at Immingham Docks, as he spoke in broken English of what he saw as the natural desire of all peoples to live like that – and his frustration at what he saw as the leaders of the nations, his own included, in failing to be able to achieve that.

And they are good words as we remember this month the ending of the Great War, the world’s first example of what became known as ‘total war’. ‘It’ll all be over by Christmas’ the British Army were told – 1,568 days later, 888,246 British lives were lost. Nine to 15 million lives lost in total. Sixty-five million men from 30 countries involved. The ‘war to end all wars’ was what was hoped for then.

As Christians we know that ultimately the challenge of peace is not one of political solutions, important as they may be, but one of dealing with the human heart.

That is actually what the passage in Micah looks forward to. A time when all men and women look to the ‘mountain of the Lord, the house of the God of Jacob’ and have their hearts and minds transformed by him, which then brings in that universal peace, which we all long to live in.

That’s the ultimate vision, the ultimate hope – but until then, being peacekeepers, peacemakers in the different places we find ourselves in is something each of us is called to do, and something our world still desperately needs.

Skegness and Bad Gandersheim

Our town of Skegness has been twinned with Bad Gandersheim in Germany since 1979 and during that time there have been many trips to the town by Skegness residents and many Gandersheimers have visited bracing Skegness. Recently local artist John Byford installed an 'objet d'art' in the centre of Bad Gandersheim – a British telephone booth. The booth is painted white, white for peace and inside the booth are the names of the fallen from World War One who originated from Skegness and Bad Gandersheim.

This month's issue of Shoreline commemorates the centenary of Armistice Day on 11 November which is also Remembrance Day in the UK and it seemed appropriate to show these names and the telephone booth known in Bad Gandersheim as 'The Box.'

The Box is a place of memorial to commemorate those from both towns who never returned home. The names are shown alphabetically with the English and German together. Some names are so similar it's almost unclear if it is the name of a Skegnessian or a Gandersheimer.

After the Service of Remembrance at Skegness on Sunday 11 November, our mayor, Councillor Sid Dennis and John Byford are travelling to Bad Gandersheim where on Tuesday 13 November there will be a special commemorative service attended by the mayors of both towns. They are even taking over several hundred copies of Shoreline to distribute in Bad Gandersheim.

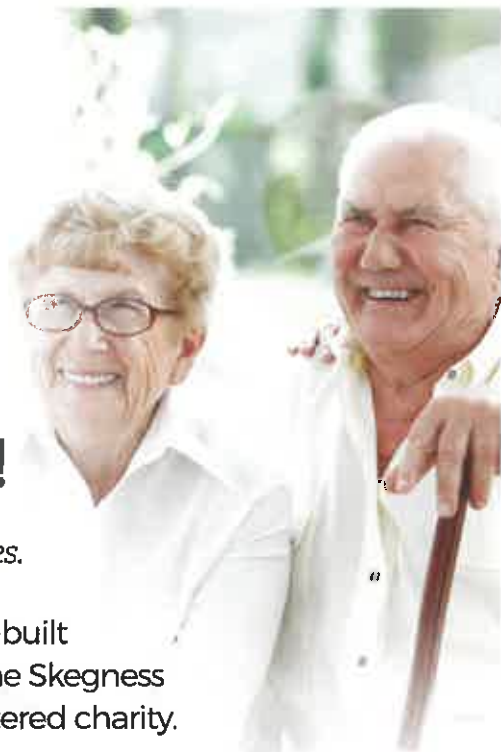

A Village Remembers - Heroes Lost in Two World Wars



On the original Armistice Day, 11 November 1918, the loss of just one young man from the village of Chapel St Leonards was still fresh in the minds of the Hill family and the whole tightly-knit community. Mark Hill, an Army private, had been killed in action in late summer 1917, at Monchy le Preux, not far from the French city where his unit had taken part in the huge Battle of Arras in the spring of that year. A memorial subsequently erected in the graveyard of St Leonard's Church bears the inscription: 'To the Glory of God and in Memory of Pte. Mark Hill, 5th Royal Berks, 13th Sep 1917, aged 21 years. Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. This Memorial is erected by the Parishioners.'

Moving forward in time, to September 1944, towards the end of World War Two, May Hill, the widow of Mark's brother Will, wrote in her diary "I took flowers to the churchyard, I really

had a nice bunch out of our garden to-day. Pink and mauve asters, larkspur, and purple spike for the brown jar and red antirrhinums and dahlias for the other; I put a few on Mark's memorial. It was 27 years on Wednesday since he was "killed in action". It was lovely weather not like this wet cold summer. He was 21 so would have been 48 now. "They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old."

Three more members of the Hill family, all nephews of May and Will, were lost in World War Two and their names, along with that of one other village lad, were added to the war memorial on a new plinth inserted above the original base:

Anthony Hill RAF
Kenneth Hill RAF
Raymond Hill Army
Hugh Green Navy

All are honoured annually in the Remembrance Day service held around the memorial.

St Matthew's Church is celebrating the award of 10 silhouettes funded by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust.

To mark the centenary of the Armistice, the display of silhouettes will sit in our pews with the names of those on the war memorial and a poppy placed by them.

The display, to which many volunteers have contributed, will be shown in the church throughout November. It is hoped the event will help people commemorate the sacrifice of around 700,000 soldiers who went to war and did not return home and to think about families and communities affected by the severity of loss during WW1 which ended in 1918. It also aims to educate future generations and to give thanks for peace and ensure we do not see death on this scale in the future.

The award was made under the Armistice and Armed Forces Communities programme. This programme gives awards to bring communities together to remember and to think about the Armed Forces today.

The event is open to everyone and we do hope that you will take the opportunity to visit St Matthew's and view the display.
