A Letter From The Bishop of Grantham

Dear Friends,

I hope you will understand when I say that I have been really unsure as to what to write in this letter for August. A number of drafts have ended up 'on the floor'. How to write something that is appropriate for our times – when the times seem to be so fast moving? Every time I get some words down on paper, something big seems to happen in the world, the latest being the arrival of a new Prime Minister. In the face of such upheaval, what are we to do and to say?

Well, I am going to say in this letter what I have been saying to people as I have met them face to face over the past few weeks, and what I usually ask people in more normal times as well: 'How are you?'

This is a genuine question. I really am interested in the answer. If we can do nothing else in a highly-charged, confusing, fast-moving context, in which emotions are all over the place and hopes and fears are clashing pretty equally, on different subjects, I can at least enquire about how people are feeling, and listen to them: 'How are you?'

People matter. Everyone. We are all God's children. We are all flesh and blood with feelings, aspirations and anxieties. My faith tells me this. My understanding and following of Jesus tells me this.

So: 'How are you?'

However you are, whatever you are feeling at this complicated time, please know that you are loved by God. Please also know that my fellow bishops and I are concerned for you and for the people who are in your heart.

Sometimes it is difficult to express this concern in ways that really connect – time is limited and I am all too aware of the people for whom I have care and for whom I don't think I have demonstrated that care in action very well. These people and situations become a matter for my prayer and my sorrow.

But, in common with everyone, having made my confession I then need to return to the practical opportunities that I do have to put my care into action.

So, during this complicated summer, know that you matter, and join with me, please, in putting care into action. And do feel free to reply to my question, if you choose!

May God bless you, and may you have a very good August.

The thrills and spills of the Olympics... the joy of those for whom it all came together at the right moment; the tears which flowed when it all went wrong. However much I want to ignore it, I cannot help but think that major international sporting events are important in our lives, and how our attitudes to national identity have changed over the years.

There are many reasons for cherishing our national identity; it's important to have a sense of belonging and a sense of worth as individuals within the community; and this is fed by a sense of cultural identity, heritage and the national pride which we hold dear.

One way of developing relationships is through sporting competition. But where would the major sporting events, such as the Olympic Games, the World Cup, Wimbledon be, if we didn't have some sense that we're proud to be British – or whatever. We may not win many gold medals, but it's important to support the team. We still need to relate to different nations; we're dependent on each other.

For Christians though, there is also the spiritual way; the early church experienced different nations and tribes being thrown into communion and communication with each other And it's been a mark of the Christian church ever since, to share its good news, recognising that all nations, wherever and whoever they are, belong.


Volunteers Needed

A Message From Matt Warman MP



As I write this, Skegness is blessed with three vital qualities: sunshine, bookings and ambition. And there are few more powerful reminders of just how long Skegness has been a tourist hotspot than the railway station – at one time seven platforms and a goods yard served the thousands of visitors who arrived after the station opened in 1873. Today, as a regular rail user myself, I see the exuberant enthusiasm of people looking forward to holidays that are accessible to all.

It's the gateway to the town, however, and so I'm glad that Skegness Railway Station is due for an ambitious refurbishment, seeing the fine buildings brought back into use, making the environment more welcoming, eco-friendly and, with facilities such as left luggage, much more practical too. Securing the necessary funding and getting all the right permissions will be tough, but richly rewarding at the end, showing that Skegness remains both popular and forward thinking.

Equally ambitious plans are also coming forward for the Tower Gardens Pavilion, a building that everyone agrees has seen much better days and which many would have liked to save: it's a testament to the quality of the new plans for a modern building, including a nursery, that they've attracted widespread and cross-party support. I was first shown the drawings in a room with the original Jolly Fisherman posters gazing down on me – all those who want the best for Skegness should be keenly aware that the town is shaped by history, but also by people who were incredibly ambitious for the town too. We are lucky that investors, councillors and others maintain that spirit, and are planning for the next century as well as respecting the last.

Skegness Business Awards

Nominations have opened for the 2016 Skegness Business Awards inspired and managed by the Skegness Partnership. This is the second year that the awards have been held and as reported in Shoreline earlier this year it has been a huge success with many Skegness Businesses competing to be best in class and walk away with the trophy and prestige and potential business boost that winning can bring.

The 2016 Awards were launched earlier this month at Skegness Natureland, last year's Best Attraction and Overall winner. The sponsors met for the press launch and to share their experience of last year's event with the three new sponsors, Hodgkinsons Solicitors – Best New Business, The Royal Hotel – Best Attraction and SECWHA Rest Assured Accreditation for the Accommodation Award. The Coastal Communities Fund which supports economic development in coastal communities is this year's main sponsor.

Altogether there are 10 Awards to be judged and the winners will be announced at the Grand Awards Ceremony on the 18th November at Southview. This month (August) will see the world's largest lay-Christian membership charity, Mothers' Union, mark 140 years of faithful outreach to families of all faiths and none.

Since 1876, when Mary Sumner first brought together parents in her own parish to build their confidence in bringing up their children in the Christian faith, the MU has grown to an organisation of over four million women – and men – in over 80 countries of the world.

In the Old Testament of the Bible, in the first book of Samuel, there is the story of Samuel marking an unlooked for victory against the mighty Philistines by erecting a stone between Mizpah and Shen, naming it "Ebenezer" meaning "stone of help" as a permanent reminder of the leading and guidance of God "Thus far has the Lord helped us".

Many more will know the support of its membership without any tally being taken – because in their daily lives MU members support families in prayer, in voicing their support for policy changes that benefit families and in their practical support.




